Position Summary

Under the direction of the Supervisor, Counselling Team, the Clinical Treatment Worker will:

- ➤ Provide therapeutic services, counselling and case management to aboriginal people and their family members that are in need of treatment and healing from dealing with issues such as mental health, substance abuse, and other prolonged problems.
- Assess, provide social work interventions and plan for clients and their families who are experiencing behavioural, psychological and emotional difficulties.
- ➤ Collaborate with members of the healthcare profession, the patient/family and community liaisons to assure patients' psychosocial and socioeconomics needs are addressed wherever possible.
- > Provide close monitoring of clients through follow up contacts.
- > Coordinate services with other providers as necessary.
- > Implement and provide services which combine traditional and contemporary models of healing.
- > This position also includes the provision of staff education.

Qualifications

- ➤ Master's Degree in Social Work or Counselling Psychology from an accredited university along with a minimum of three (3) year relevant work experience, including counselling experience with children 0-12 years of age.
- Current registration in good standing or eligibility for registration in the Ontario College of Social Workers and Social Service Workers
