- Facilitating case management coordination which includes the provision of information, advocacy and referral to both agency and outside resources; including shelter and legal matters
- Providing crisis response and safety planning
- Providing individual counselling and group counselling to survivors of intimate partner abuse
- Providing support and coordination to the Agency's emergency apartment
- Also providing support and services to other agency programs
- Ensuring accurate and timely data collection for internal and external record keeping
- Being involved in program development and community liaison activities
- Effectively working in a multi-disciplinary team
- Other duties as required
