There is a temporary full-time Child & Youth Worker position on the Indigenous Team available in the Oshawa office for a period up to May 1, 2017. The start date will be in consultation with the immediate supervisor.

POSITION SUMMARY:

Responsible for ensuring provision of mandatory service to permanent wards of the Society. Responsible to ensure all legislative (CFSA 2000), Ministry and Society policies and regulations, respective to the wards care, are met. The Child & Youth Worker will formulate case plans and develop strategies of intervention to promote the development of the ward and lead to permanence and/or successful independence. The Child & Youth Worker is also responsible for the provision of services to the youth receiving extended care from the Society. This position will also participate in the development of the Society's Youth-in-Care program.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

A 3 year Child and Youth Worker Diploma, and a minimum of 1 year related experience. Demonstrated effective inter-personal and problem solving skills; good time management skills and ability to work in a team environment. Must be able to function well in conflictual situations and maintain a high level of confidentiality. Computer literate. Proficiency in a second language an asset.

In addition to meeting the requirements of the job description first preference will be given to FNMI (First Nations Metis Inuit) candidates as demonstrated by their lived experience, knowledge of and active participation in the indigenous culture.
