His/her responsibilities primarily centre on the protection of children, performing intake and investigations functions, or case management and family services functions.

- Minimum education: University Degree in the Human Sciences
- Direct experience as front-line child protection worker
- Skills that allow the incumbent to accurately assess individual and family functioning
- Well versed in individual and family counseling techniques that will address dysfunction within the context of a child protection mandate

- Ability to work both independently and as a member of the child protection team
