The JobOur organization is creating a roster of Child Protection Workers who would be available on<br/>a casual, on-call basis to provide Emergency After Hours Child Protection services and<br/>temporary assistance to our Protection teams. After hours coverage shifts will be offered<br/>and scheduled in advance with ability to pick up additional shifts and child protection work<br/>in accordance with the agency needs and your availability.<br/>The incumbent will report to the After Hours Manager and will have child protection<br/>responsibilities. Primary duties include: investigating and assessing matters pertaining to<br/>children in need of protection; providing support services to clients; and documentation<br/>responsibilities in accordance with the legislation and agency procedures. This is a<br/>Bargaining Unit position with CUPE Local 5319.

#### Qualifications

Preference will be given to applicants with:

- Authorization to provide Child Protection Services
- A Bachelor of Social Work or Masters of Social Work degree is preferred. A degree in Social Sciences from an accredited University, in combination with several years of child welfare experience will also be considered.
- A thorough knowledge of child welfare case management, and the CFSA.
- Demonstrated ability to assess and support people in risk situations.
- Excellent interpersonal, verbal and written communication skills.
- Strong time management skills and ability to work effectively under pressure.
- A thorough understanding of anti-oppression values and principles is important.
- An appreciation of and ability to work with a diverse community.
- Valid driver's license and access to a vehicle is required.
- Bilingualism (English/French) is a desired asset for any non-designated positions.

Compensation

Hourly rate for active work:

- Unauthorized worker \$36.39/hour
- Authorized worker \$40.00/hour (Internal candidates will be paid the greater of their regular hourly rate or \$40 per hour)

In addition, for After Hours work an on-call stipend is payable as per the following schedule:

- \$45 per day for shifts 12 hours or less Monday to Friday
- \$60 per day for shifts more than 12 hours Monday to Friday
- \$100 per day for shifts on Saturday, Sunday or paid holidays
