

Crisis Clinician: Casual Positions

The Job Reporting to the Child & Youth Mental Health Programs Managers in the Bracebridge office, the Crisis Clinicians will provide risk assessment, crisis intervention, safety planning, make connections of child, youth and/or families to appropriate support services in the community, and complete crisis intervention documentation. We are seeking Crisis Clinicians to join a weekend/holiday roster as part of the Parry Sound/Nipissing/Muskoka Crisis Response Service delivered in collaboration with Hands the Family Help Network.ca.

Intervention will be in the form of a single session therapeutic crisis response, provided by telephone or other technology, outside of the agency's regular business hours (i.e. on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays), with referral to appropriate follow-up services and supports. Qualifications

- Bachelor or Master Degree in Social Work, Psychology, Psychotherapy, or counseling from an accredited university or college, and registration in a Regulated College whose members provide psychotherapy.
- Minimum of 1-2 years' direct clinical experience with children, youth and families.
- A valid Ontario Driver's License and use of a motor vehicle.
- An understanding and knowledge of best practices in the field of child and youth mental health relative to crisis and emergency services.
- Strong assessment skills and the ability to deal with the pressure and demands of crisis intervention.
- Demonstrated ability to write clear, concise reports, computer literate and able to meet deadlines and other administrative requirements.
- Sound knowledge of the agency's mandate, policies and procedures, the Child and Family Services Act, and Ministry Standards.
- Good understanding and awareness of community services and resources.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills; ability to relate effectively.
- Ability to exercise mature and professional judgement in conflictual and stressful situations.
- Demonstrated ability to balance demands/priorities, manage time effectively and operate within a broad framework of expectations.
- Demonstrated sound judgement in the identification and assessment of risk and implementation of an appropriate therapeutic intervention.

Compensation The Crisis Clinician will be compensated with a stipend for each day on call plus flat rate for completed response calls (including documentation and any necessary follow up) as follows:

Stipends:

- \$30.00 per day; or
- \$75.00 per day for Statutory Holidays
- \$120.00 per completed response (2 calls per day); or,
- \$300.00 per completed response on a Statutory Holiday (maximum 2 calls per day).
