## Children's Services Worker

Chatham-Kent Children's Services requires a **Children's Services Worker** available to start as soon as possible. This is a one (1) year, full-time contract position (35 hours per week).

The worker will provide protective and preventative service as mandated under the Child Youth and Family Services Act to families and children; assume complete case management responsibility for a children's services caseload; assess child functioning; provide therapeutic intervention to children; provide protective services to children which includes: ensuring all of the child's needs and rights are met; participating as required in Ontario Court of Justice matters pertaining to child protection or youth justice issues; preparing reports, correspondence and documents for internal and external use.

Qualifications: Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) degree or Master of Social Work (MSW) degree. Completion of the Child Pathway to Authorization training is considered an asset; over one year and up to and including three years experience in child welfare; knowledge of Ministry Standards (Child in Care and Licensing Standards); proven ability and willingness to work as an integral member of a team; an understanding of social casework principles as they relate to service delivery to children, adolescents and families in both an individual and group format; strong assessment skills in order to assess clients needs, formulate plans of service and monitor/evaluate progress; proven crisis intervention skills; excellent oral and written communication skills; strong time management skills; computer literate; the ability to communicate in French is an asset; a valid driver's license and use of a personal vehicle.
