Reporting to the Director of Services, the Psychologist will provide psychological assessment and consultation services to clients (and their families) residing in the Agency's catchment area as well as direct clinical supervision to the Family Services Clinicians within the Children's Mental Health Services department. The Psychologist will work in collaboration with other members of the Agency's Prevention and Protection Services, including the Physician, and will be a key component of the clients' circle of care.
