## **Position Summary**

Under the direction of the Supervisor, Pre/Postnatal, the Pre/Postnatal Support Worker-VAW will:

- Provide one-on-one support, accompaniment and advocacy
- Provide safety planning and supportive counselling as needed.
- Work collaborative with all service including housing worker and provide information and referrals to safe housing and shelters.
- Coordinate and facilitate participant based groups
- Collaborate with internal and external services to develop and implement wrap-around supports that are culturally informed, trauma informed and client centered
- Provide crisis intervention and supportive counselling
- Provide flexible, mobile and accessible supports through community visits and home visiting
- Maintain and encourage ongoing networking with health and social community services
- Assist clients with transportation to appointments
- Attends case conferences when required.
- Maintains ongoing case documentation
- Prepare and submits accurate funder and client related reports and records

## What we are looking for:

- B.S.W. Degree or equivalent Degree and 2 years of relevant experience.
- Alternatively, an equivalent combination of education and experience working with Aboriginal peoples in a social services setting may be considered. Special consideration to those with experience with pregnancy, birth and early parenting including doulas.
- Pass a Vulnerable Sector Police Record Check
- Passionate about the work of ending violence against women and children.
- Knowledge of First Nations, Metis and Inuit cultures.
- Frontline experience with family violence and a strong understanding of its impacts specifically during pregnancy and postpartum
- Knowledge of the Child and Family Services Act.
- Ability to provide supportive counseling and work collaboratively with Child Welfare according to CAS/VAW collaboration agreement.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills and organizational skills.
- Professionalism, initiative and respect for confidentiality.
- Ability to work effectively with all levels of staff, to maintain effective communication and working relationships, demonstrating strong interpersonal skills, tact, sensitivity and build strong internal relationships.
