- 4. Supervise Research Assistants and MSW student placements.

- 6. Oversee the budget for FNIS.
- 7. Manage follow-up study with participating agencies.
- 8. Carry out administrative duties including preparing expense reimbursements, travel arrangements, and organizing meeting agendas.
