Reporting to the Director of Services, the Supervisor of Family Support Services is responsible for overseeing the day to day operations and all activities of the assigned team in accordance with the prescribed guidelines and regulations. The Supervisor of Family Support Services will oversee and will be responsible for a team of full-time and part-time professional employees, and is responsible for the continued development, implementation, coordination, planning and provision of voluntary and mandated support services. The Supervisor of Family Support Services advises, monitors, mentors and clinically supervises workers in all aspects of planning, organizing, and delivering program services; while using collaborative decision-making techniques to ensure the most suitable service or program is chosen to meet the needs of the children and ensure those services are delivered

Qualified applicants should have:

- Master of Social Work or Bachelor of Social Work; a Master's Degree in a related field, and/or Bachelor's degree in combination with experience.
- Minimum of 5 years of direct or indirect experience with Child Welfare.
- Preference will be given to candidates with prior supervisory experience.
- Police Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Search required.
- Valid Ontario Driver's License, Driver's Abstract, and vehicle required.
- Registration with the College of Registered Psychotherapists is an asset.
- Bilingualism (English/French) is an asset.

General Skills and Attributes:

- Excellent ability to make decisions of sound judgement, often in crisis or emergency situations, and to manage the situation appropriately.
- Demonstrated capacity to manage and facilitate change.
- Superior oral and written communication skills.
- Familiarity with the CYFSA, and relevant theories and evidence informed practices related to supporting families and youth.
- Strong clinical skills and experience with trauma and attachment.
- Ability to provide strong teambuilding, leadership and coaching skills
- Ability to manage and schedule workers to ensure adequate day-to-day coverage for the provision of necessary services
