### **Position Summary**

Under the direction of the Supervisor, Indigenous Child and Family Life Center, the Child and Youth Worker will perform outreach to and engage at-risk Indigenous youth and link with the appropriate programming and community resources.

### Main Responsibilities

- Reach out to and engage at-risk Aboriginal children, youth and families with children 0-6 years of age which promotes competency and resilience.
- Develop programs and community outreach to children, youth and families.
- Provide a range of outreach/referral services.
- Maintain relationships with internal and external resources, partnerships with community groups.
- Work collaboratively with the children, youth, caregivers and other stakeholders in the community to develop service delivery plans that ensure access to services and opportunities for healthy development.
- Engage caregivers through existing community groups and provide education, information on issues related to parenting etc.
- Participate in activities and oversee the smooth running of programs and maintain an accurate, upto-date written reports as requested.
- Other duties as assigned.

#### What we are looking for

- Post-secondary education in Child and Youth Work and 1 year experience
- Alternatively, an equivalent combination of education and experience working with Indigenous children and youth will be considered
- Understanding of the unique dynamics that exist within the First Nations, Inuit, and Métis cultures
- Knowledge of social risk factors in relation to high-priority neighbourhoods and the Urban Aboriginal community
- Knowledge and skills in the delivery of group programs and workshops
- Excellent organizational, oral/verbal/written communication skills; initiative and respect for confidentiality
- Ability to work effectively with all levels of staff, to maintain effective communication and working relationships.
