Project Manager

Reporting to the Executive Director, the Project Manager will provide day to day project management and oversight to the related organizational projects to execute solutions, attain key organizational performance improvements, and/or reduce organization business risk. This responsibility will include the planning, monitoring, evaluation, and management of projects to support and enable the achievement of strategic and business goals and objectives. The Project Manager will represent Chatham-Kent Children's Services, working closely with both internal and external partners from project initiation through closing that will promote an environment of collaboration, innovation, and the advancement of organizational endeavors.

The Project Manager will provide expert advice to Chatham-Kent Children's Services staff and management on all matters related to critical projects and champion the effective and consistent application of best practice, policy and process.
