#### **JOB SUMMARY:**

Reporting to the Prevention Supervisor, the Child and Youth Worker is responsible for ensuring the cultural, social, emotional and physical wellbeing of our First Nation children/youth and their families. The Child and Youth Worker will ensure the developmental needs of our children/youth are met using individual and youth specific programs and related communities served by Kunuwanimano in accordance with the Child, Youth and Family Services Act in the province of Ontario.

#### **REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Must have a Child and Youth Diploma, Social Services Diploma or equivalent
- A minimum of three (3) years' experience working within a social services context, preferably with Indigenous families;
- Sound understanding of harm reduction, addictions, mental health, Indigenous healing practices and history, developmental issues and high risk situations faced by children and/or youth
- Understanding systemic barriers faced by youth and the ability to advocate within these systems
- Knowledge of individual, family, child, adolescent and group behavior;
- Knowledge of local community agencies and other professional services available
- Willingness and ability to support both traditional and contemporary healing practices and experience in working with Elders, Healers and contemporary helpers;
- Must have experience in counselling, case management, file maintenance and statistical reporting;
- Ability to work collaboratively and to elicit cooperation from others;
- Ability to organize and prioritize a variety of competing and urgent demands;
- Excellent intake assessment, crisis intervention, and advocacy skills;
- Demonstrate excellent analytical, problem solving, negotiating, decision making, planning, organizational, administrative and oral and written communication skills;
- Must possess a valid "G" Ontario Driver's license, be willing to travel, able to work flexible hours;
- Must produce clear Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening
- $\bullet$  Ability to speak a native language considered a major asset.

### **KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- Plan, participate and coordinate cultural, recreational and social programming for the children and youth;

- Provide case management to youth in need of individual support such as crisis intervention, dispute resolution and other supportive intervention

- Maintains accurate and up-to-date case files according to specified time lines and provides written reports as requested.
