## **Position Summary**

Through an Aboriginal worldview the Case Manager-Family Violence and Child Development Specialist will support community members with family violence focusing on the impacts during pregnancy, birth and early child development. The Case Manager will:

- Provide one-on-one support, accompaniment and advocacy.
- Provide safety planning and support agency protocols.
- Work collaborative with all services and provide information and referrals to safe housing and shelters.
- Coordinate and facilitate participant based groups.
- Collaborate with internal and external services to develop and implement wrap-around supports including attending case conferences that are culturally informed, trauma informed and client centered.
- Work in collaboration with child welfare and attend mutual visits when required.
- Work with all family members and guide them through a cultural understanding of the impacts of violence on pregnancy, birth and child development.
- Implement child development screening tools and developmental service plans.
- Provide crisis intervention and supportive counselling.
- Provide flexible, mobile and accessible supports through community visits and home visiting.
- Assist clients with transportation to appointments.
- Maintains ongoing case documentation.
- Prepare and submits accurate funder and client related reports and records.

## What we are looking for:

- B.S.W. Degree or equivalent Degree and 2 years of relevant experience.
- Alternatively, an equivalent combination of education and experience working with Aboriginal peoples in a
  social services setting may be considered. Special consideration to those with experience with pregnancy,
  birth and child development.
- Pass a Vulnerable Sector Police Record Check.
- Valid G License and Access to a vehicle.
- Knowledge of Aboriginal worldview and a community approach to ending family violence.
- Knowledge of the impacts of family violence on all relationships including child development.
- Knowledge of First Nations, Metis and Inuit cultures.
- Strong knowledge of community resources.
- Ability to provide supportive counseling and work collaboratively with Child Welfare according to CAS/VAW collaboration agreement.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills and organizational skills.
- Professionalism, initiative and respect for confidentiality.
