Job Summary

Reporting to the In-Home Child & Youth Manager, the In-Home Child and Youth Worker is responsible for sharing the duties of a caregiver for children and youth within a culturally respectful home. The In-Home Child and Youth Worker will implement behavioral programming, provide support services, life skills coaching while creating a safe environment. The In-Home Child and Youth Worker will provide opportunities for secure attachment, develop the children and youth's capacity to regulate their own emotions, and foster youth to become resilient, healthy individuals while working in accordance with the Child Youth and Family Services Act, Ministry Standards, Agency Policies and Procedures and First Nation community codes of conduct.

Qualifications

- Social Services Diploma or other related diploma in Human Services
- One (1) year experience in a Social Services Agency or residential setting working directly with children and youth.
- Three (3) years' direct management and administration experience in a child welfare protection agency
- Equivalent combination of education and experience may be considered.

- Respect for, sensitivity towards as well as knowledge and understanding of Anishnawbek culture, traditions and the Seven Grandfather Teachings
- Ability to understand and speak Anishnaabemowin is a definite asset.
