# **Recent News**

- A comment this week by the World Health Organization (WHO) about mixing mRNA vaccines was taken out of context by a news outlet and caused some media furor that has since been clarified. Read about it <a href="here">here</a> and know that the real world evidence supports mixing vaccines as authorized.
- Efforts to fully vaccinate as many people aged 12+ as possible to fight the
   Delta variant and stay on the path of reopening continue. Still looking for a

shot? The provincial system continues to add appointments for most PHUs via the <u>vaccine booking system</u> or the Provincial Vaccine Booking Line at 1-833-943-3900. - We previously shared the Public Health Agency of Canada's <u>guidance</u> on the safety of activities based on vaccination status. It was helpful, but left out how families with children under 12 (who can't yet be vaccinated) should act. Science Up First/LaScienceDabord adapted the table for families.
