Summary

The Children's Aid Society of the District of Nipissing and Parry Sound is seeking a qualified and innovative individual to join our team in the capacity of a Clinical Supervisor. The Clinical Supervisor will report to the Clinical Psychologist and the Senior Manager of Arbour House, a newly designed residential facility for children ages 12-18 to be opened 2021. The incumbent will be responsible for but not limited to assisting with trauma specific diagnostic assessments, therapeutic interventions, counseling and support services for youth and families involved with Arbor House, as well as, to the Society's multi-service programs and regional CAS affiliates. The successful incumbent will be familiar with other services and resources in the community and work closely with them to provide information and support when required. All actions are performed according to the vision, mission, values and overall strategic direction of PARNIPCAS. This position is outside of the Bargaining Unit.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Masters Degree in psychology, social sciences or related field from an accredited university.
- Minimum three (3) years experience in the direct treatment of clients.
- Current membership in Professional College/Association.
- Other qualifications or experience deemed equivalent by the Executive Director.
- Possession of, or ability to obtain an appropriate, valid C.P.R./First Aid Certificate.
- Satisfactory Police Records Check and Vulnerable Sector Screening.
- Experience working with children, youth, and families involved with child protection services is considered an
 asset.
- Valid Ontario class 'G' Driver's Licence and satisfactory Driver's Abstract.

Additional Assets:

- Bilingualism (English/French).
- Proven understanding of neuropsychology and its relationship to trauma and behaviour is essential.
- Experience with Dialectical Behaviour Therapy, EMDR, and/or other relevant evidence based and trauma specific therapies an asset.
- Ability to maintain a high standard of privacy and confidentiality in the performance of duties.
- Respect and sensitivity for, as well as knowledge and understanding of, Indigenous, culture and traditions.
- Knowledge of Indigenous, Métis and Inuit service modalities, customs, and traditions as they relate to historical child welfare practices.
