Reporting to the Senior Counsel, **LEGAL COUNSEL** possesses specialized knowledge and skill in the management and delivery of child protection court matters. With a focus on the preparation and presentation of Court Applications through all steps, up to and including trial and appeal. This position acts of behalf of the Children's Aid Society of London and Middlesex (CASLM).

Responsibilities:

- Assume legal file responsibility including high conflict, extremely complex cases, child welfare trials.
- Prepare cases for Court by coordinating and gathering all information, evidence and witnesses as required
- Provide leadership for ADR and support the consistent consideration and utilization of ADR practices
- Provide legal consultation to service staff specific to case preparation, evidentiary requirements and court procedures and processes.
- Participate in the planning and development of internal policies and procedures

Legal Counsel will work in collaboration with the Legal Services team and Child Welfare Staff to ensure the effective and efficient delivery of legal services.

<u>Qualifications</u>: **Successful completion** of a Bachelor of Laws degree and membership, in good standing, in the Law Society of Ontario. Proven knowledge and experience in court processes up to and including preparing for and conducting trials. Minimum of 2 years' experience practicing law in a child welfare or similar setting. Proven leadership abilities that reflect personal and organizational excellence. Superior communication, critical thinking and negotiating skills.
