Job Purpose

The Researcher/Policy Analyst identifies technical assistance needs and recommends evidence-based solutions. The position is responsible for conducting research to recommend and provide support to policy development initiatives relating to a wide range of child welfare services.

Job Duties

The Researcher/Policy Analyst will lead, coordinate and undertake projects in all aspects of policy, program planning and development to advise and inform policy and program recommendations by:

1. Building and maintaining relationships with key sector stakeholders and partners
2. Writing a range of products, including briefs and/or reports summarizing key findings, potential recommendations for improvement; implementation guidance, training curriculum supports, and strategic planning tools; performance management and Quality Assurance reports; and technical assistance briefs
3. Analyzing federal, provincial, regional and/or survey data to provide insight regarding issues of policy and practice
4. Designing and facilitating onsite strategic planning sessions, training events, and other meetings with stake holders and lateral service agencies
5. Organizing and coordinating a range of individual and group technical assistance activities
6. Reviewing, recommending and/or creating data collection tools, conducting data collection activities, as well as analyzing qualitative and quantitative data for initial and ongoing technical needs assessment and best practice identification
