OVERVIEW

The Driver will transport youth and youth groups to school, medical and other service appointments, and individual and group activities as needed. The Driver functions within legislative requirements, regulations, policies, and procedures and the Mission, Beliefs, and Vision of the Kina Gbezhgomi Child and Family Services and contributes to accomplishing the strategic priorities. The Driver will provide safe transportation to and from various locations while maintaining a supportive and positive atmosphere. The Driver is responsible for appropriately conducting themselves, and setting an example for youth, and co-workers by reflecting KGCFS core values, vision, and mission.

- The ability to speak the Anishinaabe language is a definite asset and / or willingness for continual learning. Preference will be given to applicants who can speak or write Ojibway, provided they have skills, ability and qualifications to do the job.

WORK ENVIRONMENT

- Given the traditional practices of the Anishinabek, from time-to-time exposure to wood smoke and the burning of sacred medicines, including tobacco, sweet grass, sage, or cedar, may occur within the work setting.
